

The Future Perfect & The Future Perfect Continuous

- Usamos el futuro perfecto para decir que algo ya habrá ocurrido antes de un momento exacto en el futuro.
 - Tom's football match ends at 9.15, so after this time, for example at 9.30, the match will have finished.
 - Next year is Ted and Amy's 25th wedding anniversary. They will have been married for 25 years. (Now they have been married for 24 years).
- El futuro perfecto continuo se utiliza en lugar del simple cuando la duración de la acción es lo importante y no el resultado.
 - By the end of the month he will have been training horses for twenty years.
